1715 Nelson Ave. HDFC Completes Weatherization



On December 6, 2010, 1715 Nelson Ave. HDFC in the Bronx became the first building to become fully weatherized through UHAB's Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP). The grant, which is part of an energy efficiency and conservation program administered by New York State Homes and Community Renewal and the U.S. Department of Energy, covers a wide array of energy fixes in HDFCs.

Once 1715 Nelson qualified for the program, the UHAB

Weatherization team worked with the Community Environmental Center to produce an energy audit that determined the scope of work to be covered by the grant. And now, with two months of construction completed, the residents of 1715 Nelson have a much more efficient building: both in terms of energy use and monetary savings.

1715 Nelson first underwent pipe and boiler insulation, roof insulation, and a series of improvements to vents and valves. Then, each unit had brand new windows installed, as well as new energy star refrigerators. Compact fluorescent lights were also put in to replace all the lights in each unit, as well as those in the hallways and common spaces.

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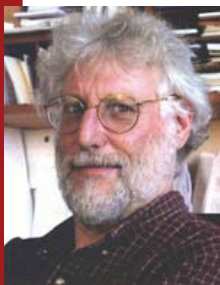

electricians were good, the roofers were good. What I really like the most about it is that it moved along quickly," said Wendy Williams, Board Vice President.

Without a doubt, residents were most excited about getting new windows installed in their apartments, as the previous ones were over 27 years old. "I've never seen people as happy as they are the last few days.

They're smiling from ear to ear," said Alex Pressley, one of UHAB's Construction Managers, during window installation. "We needed them- it was so cold. And installation went A-OK. I'd give them a golden star," said board member Annie Thigpen.

In addition to physical comforts, the weatherization process is estimated to save the building over \$29,000 in expenses in the first year alone. "We hope to save a lot on heat: the roof is

much better thanks to blown-in insulation," noted Wendy Williams. Further, the board hopes that the improvements will encourage more tenants to become shareholders in the building. "That's what it's all about...that is what keeps the building going, together," said Herman Kendrick, Board Treasurer.

UHAB's Weatherization team is beginning construction on their next building, 2178 Atlantic Ave. in Brooklyn, this January. The 16-unit building, brought back from the brink of foreclosure with the help of Preservation Manager Ann Henderson, is getting a much-needed boiler system replacement so that heat will work properly during the winter months.

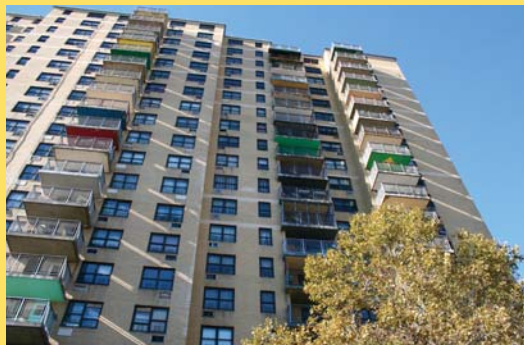

HDFC Building of the Year: Cloverleaf Tower HDFC



Cloverleaf Tower HDFC is a true snapshot of New York City. Its 239 families are as diverse as the city's population, and the residents and Board of the building have worked together to create a truly affordable housing cooperative: all apartments are available to families with incomes at or below 50% of the area median income. To honor their dedication and commitment, Cloverleaf Tower HDFC was chosen as UHAB's *HDFC Building of the Year* in 2010.

Cloverleaf Tower HDFC is a twenty story building located at 920 Metcalf Avenue in the Soundview area of the Bronx. Developed as rental apartments under the Mitchell-Lama program, it was foreclosed on by the city when the owners defaulted on their mortgages in 1981. It was managed by the city until it was sold to the residents of 920 Metcalf Ave. in June of 2002.

"Today if you go to Cloverleaf, you will see 2 modern parking facilities, a modern laundry room, a soon-to-be-updated community center, and also an upgraded playground," stated Radames Revilla, President of Cloverleaf's Board of Directors, as he accepted the buildings' *HDFC Building of the Year* award. Radames also added that the building is "very proud of the fact that" they were recently able to complete local 11 work, and install a new roof, without taking out a loan. Radames also expressed his thanks to Cloverleaf's Managing Agent Josh Koppel, and H.S.C. Management Corp., for their dedication to the building and its shareholders.

The residents of 920 Metcalf Avenue have been working closely with Fernando Alarcon, Associate Director of Co-op Preservation, and other UHAB staff for the past eight years to purchase the building from the

City of New York, secure the necessary loans, convert to a limited equity cooperative, and secure a tax cap to keep the building affordable for its current and future residents.

Today, Cloverleaf Tower HDFC is a truly affordable housing cooperative with a Board of shareholders elected every year to assure its continued viability. Congratulations to Cloverleaf Tower HDFC!
